# **JAMES BENJAMIN MORTEN POYNTER**



8 Sept 1874 – James Benjamin Morton POYNTER was born in Poverty Bay. His is the son of James Benjamin Poynter and Maraea Morete.

Maraea Morete, also known as Maria Morris, is said to have been born on 24 July 1844 at Whakaari, near Tangoio, Hawke's Bay, although she may have been born at Waikokopu, Mahia. She was the eldest child of Puihi and William Morris. Puihi was a woman of mana of Te Aitanga-a-Mahaki, the people of the Turanga plain, inland from Poverty Bay

**25 June 1901** – J B Poynter returned to NZ on the SS Whakatane.

**1901** – Married Mary Harlicone Forsythe in Napier They had 1 son & 3 daughters

**1903** – Joined the 9<sup>th</sup> Regt of the Wellington EC Mounted Rifles

Mr JAMES B POYNTER of Gisborne, who was unable to get into the R.F.C., is going to join the N Z forces in France, and hopes to be with the Pioneers on service within a fortnight..

**1916** – Saw service in France with the NZ Pioneer Battalion & the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wellington Infantry 9<sup>th</sup> Coy – promoted to Lance Corporal during this time

**5 January 1917 – J B Poynter** is reported to be wounded and has been admitted to hospital
