STOKER THOMAS McGLINCHY, son of Mr and Mrs P. McGlinchy, 126, Canon Street, St Albans, previously reported missing, now officially presumed dead. Stoker McGlinchy was serving on H.M.S. Electric, which was sunk near Singapore in February, 1941.
