Mr. C. C. Cox

Mr. Cecil Cleve Cox, manager and secretary of the Barwon Heads Golf Club, died at his home, Barwon Heads. Mr. Cox was a native of New Zealand, and except for fifteen years in Victoria, spent his life in New Zealand. Most of his time in Victoria was spent at Geelong and Barwon Heads, where he was very widely known. He came to Geelong as manager of the Geelong branch of the Bank of Australasia, and while in that position identified himself with the Geelong Tennis Club and the Geelong Golf Club, and was the inaugurator of the scheme for the laying down of turf tennis courts at the golf club's grounds. He was singles champion in New Zealand in 1898. Mr. Cox left Geelong for New Zealand to manage a branch of the bank there, and it was while in New Zealand that he retired. He then returned to Geelong, and accepted the position of manager and secretary of the Barwon Heads Golf Club.
