some fine, hard running. Outstanding back of the game was undoubtedly **J. S. Cartwright**, Canterbury's 13.7 winger, whose exceptional speed, violent fend and neat infield kicking had the marks of a coming international.

Canterbury's try came from one of **Cartwright's** spectacular bursts around his marker. He took the ball between the twenty-five and half-way, ran forty yards across the other wing, in-passed to Williams, took the forward's return and opened the way brilliantly for A. G. Hunter, the centre, who outpaced the Auckland defence. **Cartwright** also kicked Canterbury's penalty.

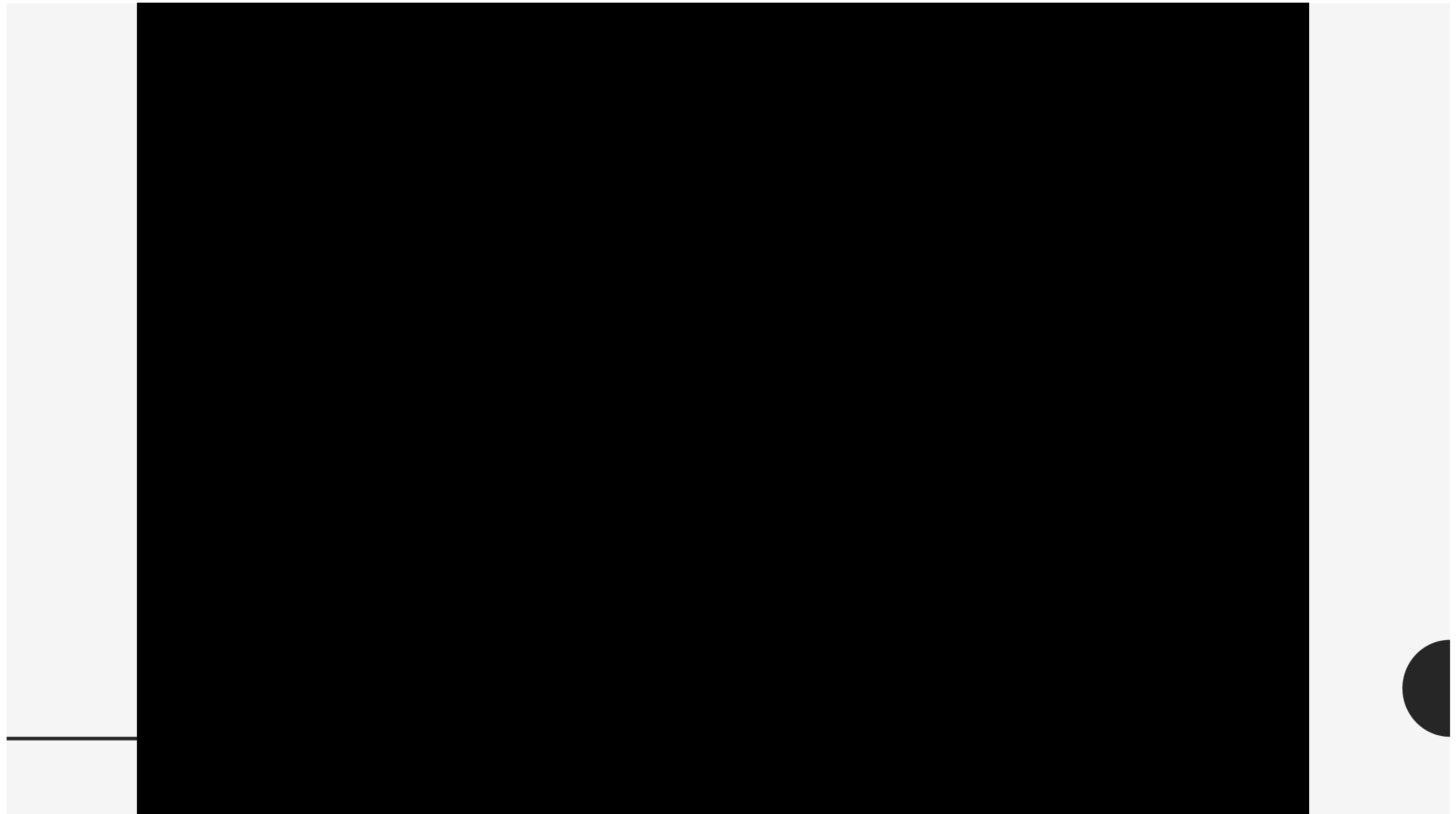

In the Spring of 1944 she was moved to the Channel to prepare for "Operation Neptune". On 6th June 1944 she escorted 31 tank landing craft of the 8th Armoured Brigade, the first main battle tanks to land, those of B and C Squadrons of the 4/7 Dragoon Guards. On 13th June she was returning to England for more escort duties, when she was attacked by a single German aircraft.

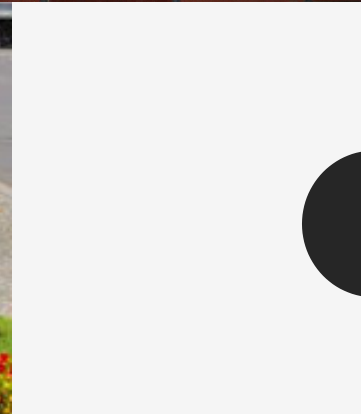
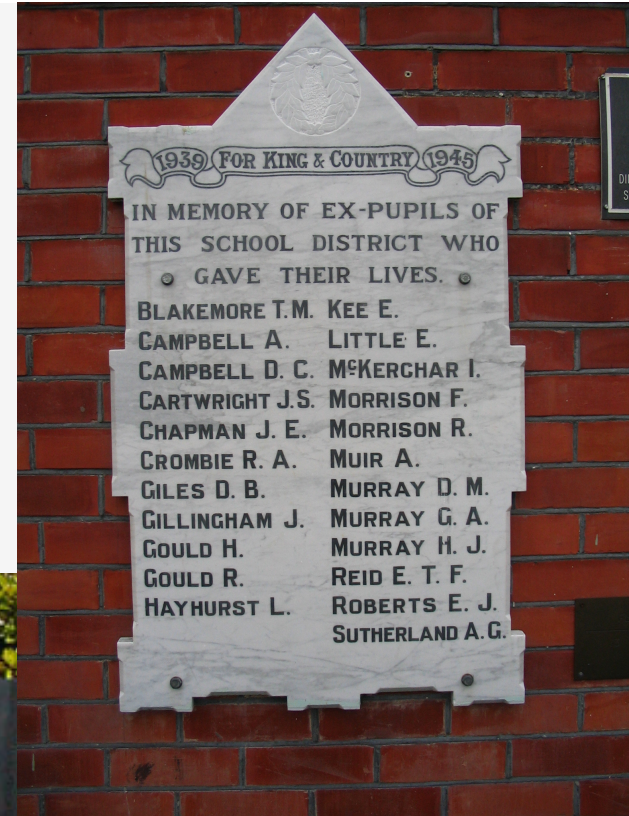
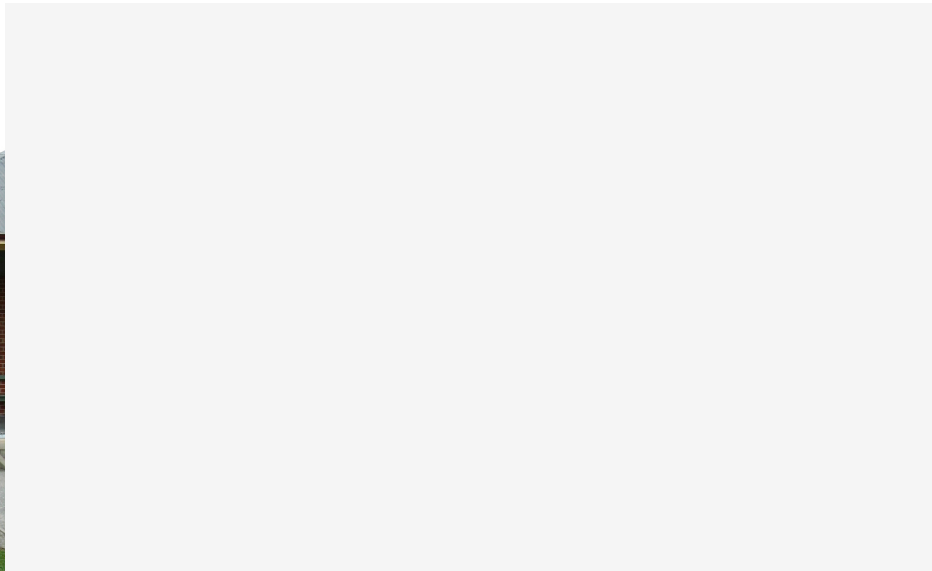
