Obituary of Charles Frederick Schrafft I Dated 27.05.1930

OBITUARY, VETERAN OF MAORI WAR. MR. C. F. SCHRAFFT. At the age of 84 years, a veteran of the war with the Maoris, Mr. Charles Frederick Schrafft, died on May 25 at his home, Murdoch Road, Grey Lynn. He was born in Germany, and at the age of 16 years went to the Victorian goldfields. He came to New Zealand with 50 other young men who enlisted to help in fighting the Maoris. He joined the Forest Rangers and served under Major Jackson. Later he joined the Armed Constabulary and under Major Von Tempsky hunted the Hauhau leader, Te Kooti. After the war he took up land in the Waikato and later came to Auckland, where he founded a business, from which he retired 30 years ago. Mrs/ Schrafft survives her husband, and there are the following children:—Mesdames R. Tye, of Devonport; L. Seward, of Sandringham, and A. Stonex, of Matamata, and Messrs. Walter Schrafft, of Auckland; William Schrafft, of Mount Albert, and Frederick Schrafft, of Walton
