



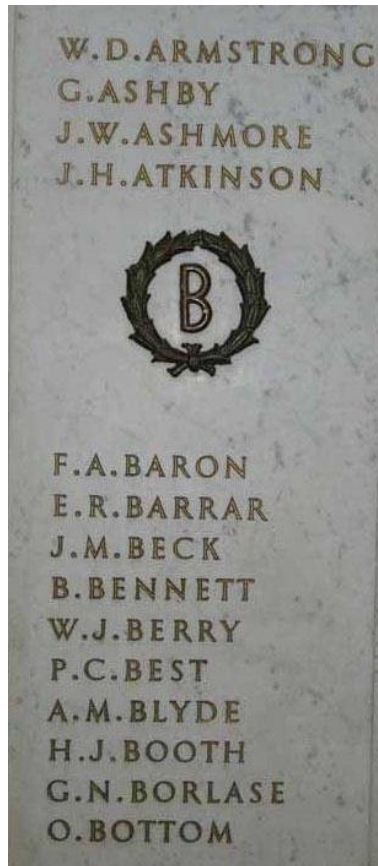

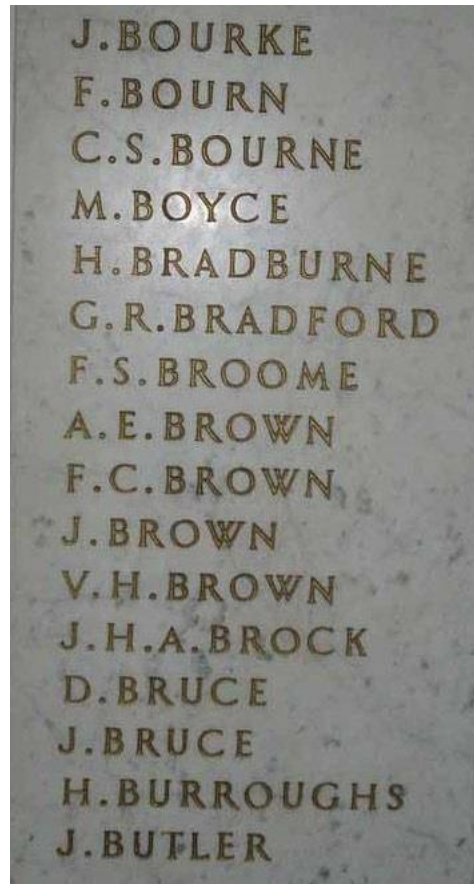

2	EDWARDS, Herbert Augustine <i>(born Ireland 1870)</i>	2330	Corporal	New Zealand Rhodesian Field Force Artillery	Enlisted with the 11 th Company (Auckland section), 5 th Contingent N.Z. Mounted Rifles (Imperial Bushmen); disembarked Beira, P.E.A. 27/4/1900; killed accidentally in an explosion when covering a landmine with soil at Zeerust with Lieutenant N. <p>BECK, John Enlisted as John M. Beck. He is listed on his birth certificate as Hans Jebsen Beck, born 20 January 1878 in Tamaki Hawkes Bay (<i>Birth Certificate sighted April 2016</i>). Son of Anna Maria Beck (nee Hansen) and Matthias Beck of originally of Denmark. His brother Matthias Beck (10/2855) was killed in action during WWI (4 October 1917).</p>	<p>Herbert Augustine Edwards was born 21 Jan 1870 Dawson Grove, Monaghan, Ireland. His father was Rev. Henry Saint George Edwards who died 1882 late March-early April of Typhoid Fever while Rector of Stedham, Midhurst, Sussex England.</p>
<p>KENDALL, Arthur William He was one of the few Maori serving in the New Zealand Contingent. He was also known as Waata Kanara or A. Waata Kendall. His father George William Kendall was a storekeeper (died 1921) and his mother was Neta Atania (Atama) (Sarah Annie?) Kendall He died suddenly after taking his breakfast of milk.</p>	<p>FORBES, Frederick William Duncan Gunner W. F. Forbes received a military funeral on 15 July 1901. Dense crowds lined the streets to watch his coffin pass by on a 'B' Battery gun carriage. Returned to New Zealand on "Tagus" (ship) 11 July 1901.</p>
<p>ENTERIC FEVER Before WW I, enteric fever, or typhoid fever, was the scourge of armies, and in the Anglo-Boer War killed more soldiers than enemy action. It is caused by a bacteria entering the body via contaminated food or water. Early symptoms include high fever, headaches and lassitude. Follicles along the intestinal walls later become inflamed, often leading to perforation and haemorrhaging. Other complications include gall bladder, pneumonia or heart failure. At the time of the Boer War, there were no antibiotic remedies for the disease.</p>	<p>WITHERS, Thomas Trooper Withers was the grandson of of Major Edward Withers, formerly commanding the Auckland district, and at one time the 65th Regiment.</p>

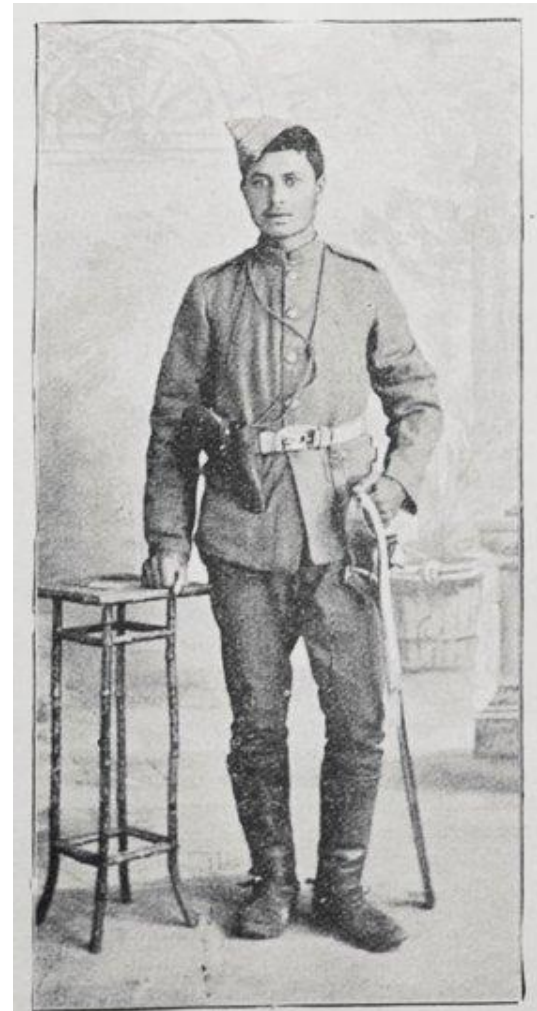

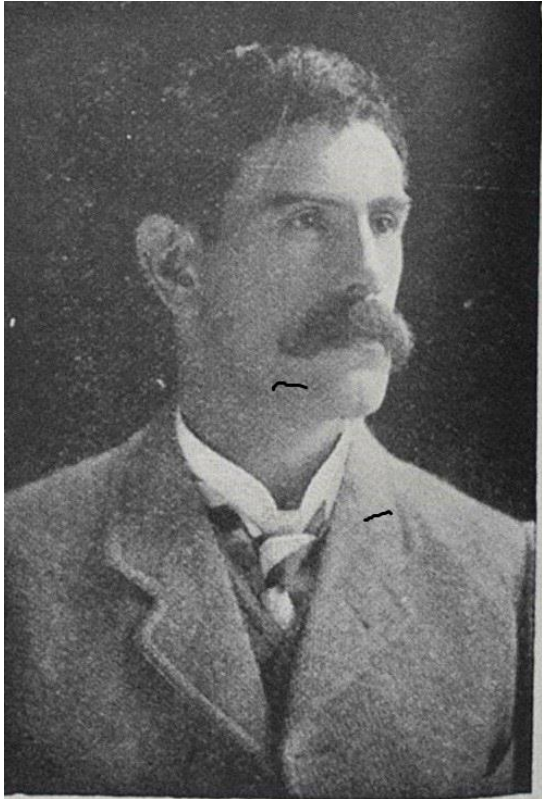

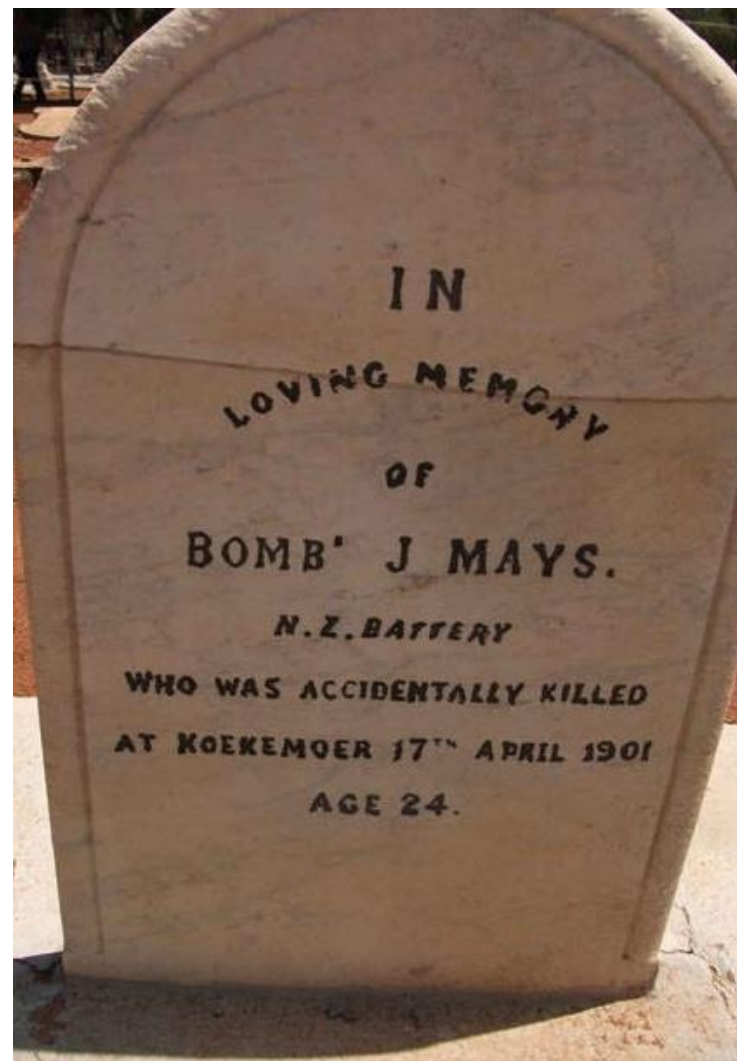

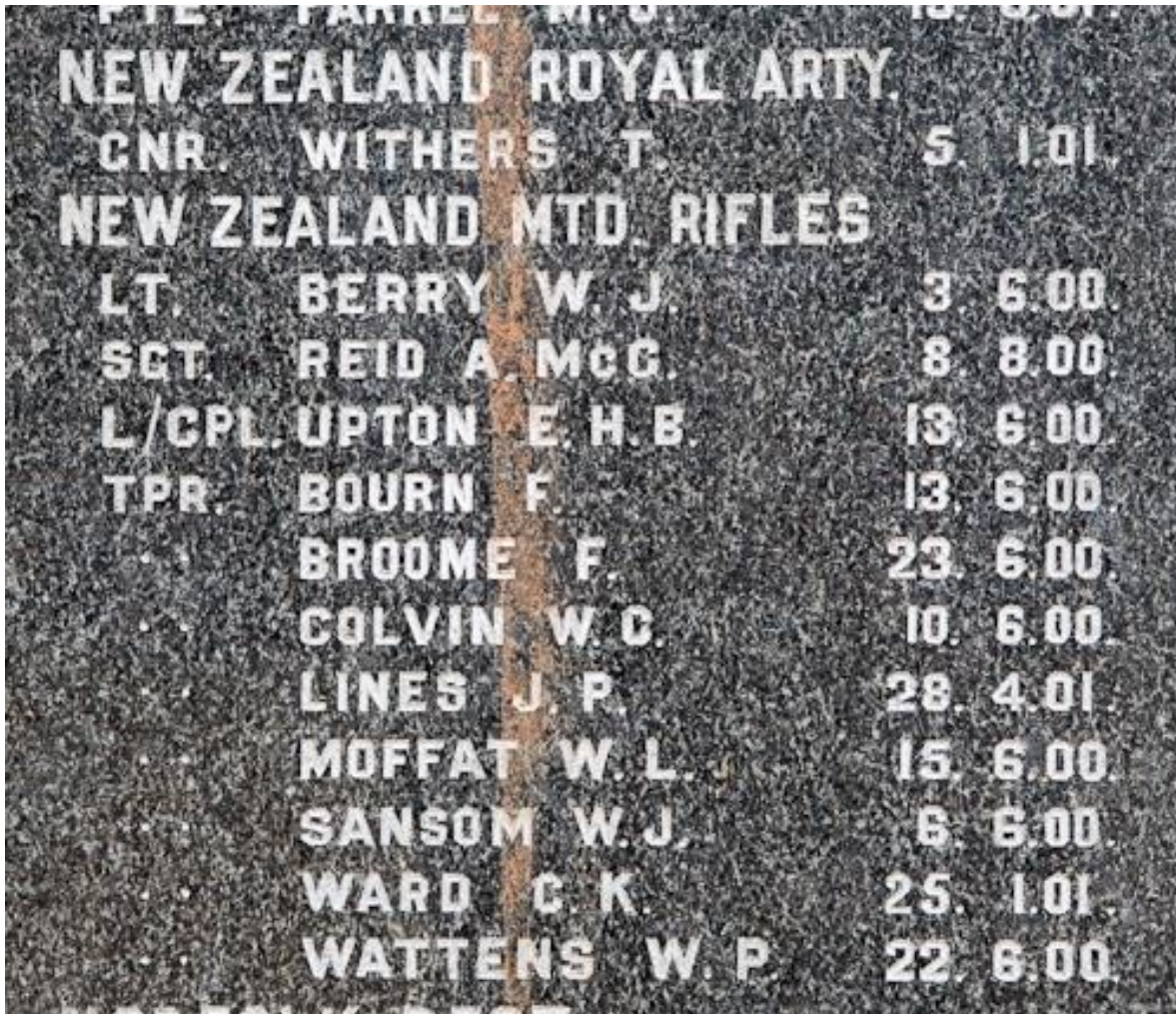
